February 12, 2020

Minutes

President Joe Halbach called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. In attendance were Joe Halbach, Michelle Moehn, Athletic Director Corey Behnke, Jill Frank, Shane Glidden, Maria Halbach, Janet Murphy, Leona Propson and Ann Wilcox.

Minutes of January Meeting: Leona P. made a motion to accept the January meeting minutes and Janet M. seconded it. M/C

Treasurer's Report: Ben H. was unable to make the meeting, but he emailed the following information regarding the income/expenses for the previous month:

Expenses:

Alysha Brickl - referee fee - \$60

Kelly Moehn - golf bags - \$979.20

Leona Propson - tournament ref fees/janitor fees- \$1,010

Cindy Rowland - reimbursement - \$229.84

AFS football concession- \$1,744.00

Dance team football concession- \$ 1,233.25

Reedsville Area Youth Sports (Chilton girls basketball entry) - \$150.00

Jane Schmitz – reimbursement - \$50.00

Deposits - \$6,626.50

Jill F. believed the dance team was overpaid for working volleyball concessions. Jill F. will contact Ben to let him know that clubs (who do not receive CBC funds) are paid \$150 per night to work concession stands for volleyball and basketball games, and they do not receive a percentage of profit.

Shane G. made a motion to accept the treasurer's report (with recommended changes) and Ann W. seconded it. M/C

Athletic Director Report:

A discussion was held regarding the ice machines currently at the school; one in the concession stand and one in the training room. Both are older and are in need of repairs. Corey B. looked into pricing and determined the machines are very expensive to replace, costing approximately \$10,000 total to replace both of them. It was decided to keep trying to fix the ice machines as necessary. It was further decided that it would not be necessary to replace the ice machine in

the concession stand, as it is not used that often. If one of the units were to fail and not be able to be repaired, the working unit would remain in the training room.

Corey discussed some maintenance concerns after events are held in the gym. It was suggested that soda cans be replaced with plastic bottles so they have caps. It was mentioned that typically soda is not sold, but they were trying to sell the soda left over from tournaments. A discussion was also held regarding nachos. Spectators do not throw away the plastic trays and, when cleaning with the blowers, the trays get flipped and cheese spills out. We did not believe nachos were a big seller, so we could consider eliminating nacho sales for future sporting events held in the gym. This should be re-addressed prior to fall sports.

Corey advised that athletic coaches were requesting more flexibility regarding what can be paid with the \$400 in sport support they currently receive each year. As of now, it is their understanding that the \$400 is only to be used for tournament fees. Coaches are requesting to use some of the funds to pay unpaid volunteers who assist the coaches during their sport season. Joe H. did not believe the bylaws restricted what the sport support money should be used for.

Shane asked Corey B. about the TrainHeroic program. Corey B. said the kids are using the program, and he has received positive feedback from them. They are currently working on getting members of the community to use it as well.

Corey B. mentioned that the outdoor baseball batting cage net has a hole in it.

Baseball and softball scoreboards have been installed; just need power to them yet.

Corey B. to bring wishlist items to the March meeting.

Presidents Report:

A discussion was held regarding scholarships given by CBC to graduating high school seniors. It was decided that CBC would again give out three \$500 scholarships. Applications are due in April.

Basketball Tournaments:

Girls - Recap: Leona P. discussed the girls basketball tournament. Leona believed profit would be approximately \$1,500. Leona P. mentioned the first invitation sent was for both girls and boys, but when boys offered a price reduction, that caused confusion for those signing up for the girls tournament. Emails for boys and girls should be separated after initial email.

Leona mentioned there was minimal parent support/volunteers at the tournament. **Parents are expected to volunteer at tournaments.** Funds raised at these events will eventually be used to pay tournament fees and purchase items for their sport in years to come. Typically, the teams

do not play at the same time, so there are ample opportunities for the parent(s) to volunteer while their child is not playing.

Unfinished Business:

New Fundraiser: Michelle M. heard back from the Chilton High School Vertical Class Reunion committee. They have agreed to allow us to do a 50/50 raffle at the event scheduled for July 25, 2020, at the Calumet County Fairgrounds.
